Primary PE and Sports Premium Plan 2022- 2023

What is the Primary PE and Sport Premium?

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Accountability

Since September 2013, schools are held to account over how they spend their additional funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' Handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision offered.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

Rushbrook's aims:

- To ensure that we maintain 100% of teaching in Physical Education being graded as good or outstanding
- To teach high quality PE sessions that inspire/engage all children to exceed personal potential.
- Children to be working in line with national expectations, using the Bronze, Silver and Gold assessment criteria created
- To enter sporting competitions
- To create a number of educational/sporting opportunities for young people and parents/ carers within the community



How are we using the funding to benefit our children?

At Rushbrook Primary Academy we have allocated the funding in a number of ways:

- Professional development and collaboration opportunities for the PE team across the whole Trust, increasing confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport*
- To teach high quality PE sessions that inspire/engage all children to exceed personal potential*
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement*
- Providing pupils with the opportunity to compete in the Manchester PE association games. Use of mini buses, so that children can attend competitions and outdoor PE activities*
- Hiring specialist coaches and developing strong links with a number of agencies including Dream Big Sports and Diane Modahl Sports' Foundation and Manchester Schools PE*
- Extending the range of after school clubs that are offered: basketball, athletics, football, cross country, dodgeball, hockey and cricket*
- Providing sports kits for children competing in competitions. increased participation in competitive sport*
- Buying additional equipment so that children are given the opportunity to experience a variety of sports. Broadening experiences of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils*
- Engaging of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school. This is to be completed during the school day and at Breakfast Club*
- Providing cover to release staff for professional development in PE and sport*

In 2022/ 2023 we are hoping to secure funding that will allow us to educate families and young people within the community to allow them to feel confident about leading and participating in a number of clubs.
